## CLASSIS QUINTE CANADIAN INDIGENOUS MINISTRY REPORT January 2023



## URBAN INDIGENOUS MINISTRIES




**EDMONTON NATIVE HEALING CENTER** continues its work under the direction of Pastor Harold Roscher .
